Historical and Practical Bacalà Mantecato Workshop/Laboratorio Storico e Pratico di Bacalà Mantecato

In this newsletter, we want to talk about **Enrico Berton's project "El Cogo,"** a Laboratorio di Bacalà Mantecato that combines Venetian gastronomic tradition with history, adding cultural value.

The aim of this project is to explore the **historical**, **cultural**, **and commercial background of Venice**, which has played a vital role in shaping the strong gastronomic identity associated with this iconic dish. In addition, "El Cogo" seeks to offer a comparative perspective and establish connections with other Italian and European cities that share similar historical ties with Venice.

The project unfolds across different contexts, both as an independent experience and in collaboration with local organizations. Through themed tastings with wine shops and wineries, historical and cultural events, or private, in-home experiences, "El Cogo" brings Venetian tradition to life.



WHAT HAPPENED IN THE MEANTIME

Via Querinissima in Bruxelles

On the occasion of the European Week of Regions in Bruxelles, a meeting was held on Wednesday, October 9th, at 4:30 PM at the **Nordic House of the Västra Götaland Region** to present the 'Via Querinissima project. The event, organized by the Swedish partner, the Västra Götaland Region, provided an opportunity to strengthen the European network.



Draw Your Map Project

"Draw Your Map" is a pilot initiative launched by Via Querinissima in schools throughout the Association area, designed to engage **students aged 7 to 14** with the story of Pietro Querini and the values of his journey.

The project invites each school to join a competition by **creating a map that illustrates this story**, **using the content and techniques they find most effective and creative**. Additionally, a parallel exhibition will be held at VQ offices.

The initiative will conclude with an awards ceremony for the winning schools in September 2025.

Lecture at University of Parma and 10th DIAITA Luso-Brazilian Colloquium on Heritage, History, and Food Cultures at the University of Coimbra

Marzia Liuzza, member of our scientific committee delivered a lecture at the University of Parma as part of the Economic History of Europe and European Food course. The lecture examined the topic of stockfish using historical documents and cultural projects to emphasize its significance. Moreover from October 24th to 26th she took part at 10th DIAITA Luso-Brazilian Colloquium on Heritage, History, and Food Cultures at the University of Coimbra. With Professor Benedetta Crivelli (University of Parma) she took part at the session "Banquetes e celebrações políticas" with a presentation entitled From the Shipwreck of Pietro Querini to the Italian Tables. 

Insights from our Scientific Committee

In 1924 the young Finnish architects Aino and Alvar Aalto, chose Italy as their honeymoon destination. Like Querini, who brought back cultural elements from the Nordic countries, the Aaltos travelled through Italy to absorb its art and architecture, influences that would accompany them on their return to Finland.

Aino and Alvar Aalto. The honeymoon route in Italy 1924-2024 Florence, Padua, Venice 8th-11th October 2024

Italy has a privileged space in the lives and careers of Aino and Alvar Aalto. One hundred years ago, in October 1924, they have chosen Italy for their honeymoon, largely following an itinerary that Aino had already experienced three years earlier after graduating in architecture. The form of the travel was innovative, by seaplane from Katajanokka bay to Tallinn, then by flight to Vienna and train to cross the Alps and reach Veneto and then Tuscany. On October 8th 1924, Aino and Alvar Aalto left Helsinki. Their Italian itinerary touched Verona, Padua and Florence, the most important destination being Venice. Back to Jyväskylä, still with little commissions, the young architects oriented their proposals for the town with a clear Italian vision, the mountain and hilly landscape, the townscape, especially the 'piazza', Florentine Renaissance of Brunelleschi and Leon Battista Alberti. The image of the Sacello Rucellai by Leon Battista Alberti was mirrored in their first important work in Jyväskylä, the Workers Club.

To mark the centennial of the honeymoon, a travelling event has been organised to Florence, Padua and Venice from October 8th to 11th 2024, with special visits based on their memories through diaries, photos and postcards, writings and projects inspired by the journey. The event, promoted by Università Politecnica delle Marche and Alvar Aalto Foundation in cooperation with Fondazione Giovanni Michelucci, Alvar Aalto Route - 20th Century Architecture and Design, Allan and Bo Hjelt Art Foundation, and supported by several institutions in the three cities, hopefully can be added to the Alvar Aalto Route of the Council of Europe.

November 4th


On November 4th, a seminar on the Via Querinissima will be held at the Veneto Regional Council with students from the Master's Degree Course in Landscape Science, University of Padova.


Arctic Light is not an end; it's a new beginning. Because even though the stage lights are going out and the Capital of Culture year will soon be over, this is really when everything starts.
