

DID YOU KNOW THAT:

The Swedish Route

The Swedish itinerary of Via Querinissima is a fascinating journey through history and culture, retracing Pietro Querini's path along ancient medieval pilgrimage routes and sites associated with iconic figures such as **Saint Olav and Saint Bridget**. Indeed, It is likely that Querini followed the ancient **Österdalsleden**, a route used by pilgrims traveling between Trondheim and Vadstena, famous not only for its stunning landscapes but also for its historical significance.

In **Vadstena**, Querini and his crew found hospitality at the church founded by **Saint Bridget**, a place Querini described in his diary as extraordinary, with forty-two altars and beautifully decorated ceilings. This sanctuary, a major pilgrimage destination, became a pivotal point in their journey.

Continuing along the route, Querini reached **Stegeborg Castle in Söderköping**, where Venetian nobleman Zuanne Franco welcomed them with generous hospitality for over forty days, a kindness that Querini vividly recorded in his diary.

Today, visitors can immerse themselves in this heritage by exploring places like **Vadstena Church**, **the Lödöse Museum**, **and Linköping's Stiftsbiblioteket**, all of which showcase Sweden's medieval past and its connection to Querini's extraordinary journey.

European Conference on the Wine Region in Portugal

The director, Nicoletta Martorana, attended the European Wine Conference in Portugal, an important opportunity for dialogue and exchange. Portugal represents a key stop for Via Querinissima, both historically—Querini stayed in Lisbon—and thematically, as it highlights medieval trade routes and cultural connections through Malvasia and cod.

During the event, Portugal's eno-gastronomic heritage was celebrated as a fundamental part of its identity, symbolizing exchange and shared traditions that bridge history, cuisine, and local culture.

Furthermore, we highlighted the strong partnership between our itinerary and the **European Cultural Route Iter Vitis**, with whom we collaborate to promote culture, history, and sustainable tourism. Through exhibitions, conferences, and eno-gastronomic itineraries, we aim to explore how Malvasia played a key role in the commercial and cultural networks that continue to connect European regions today.

The conference was also a valuable occasion to reflect on ways to further enhance Portugal's enogastronomic heritage and create new opportunities for development, reinforcing the role of food and wine as essential elements of cultural identity and economic growth



The maritime route to Santiago: a project by Ría de Muros Noia Association

The route from Muros to Santiago intersects with the Via Querinissima. On September 26 1431, Pietro Querini arrived in Muros and travelled to Compostela with some members of his crew to pray to St. James.

There are many paths and routes that lead to Santiago, but few are as captivating as the **one that follows the sea and flows into the Ría de Muros and Noia on the edge of the Rías Baixas.** This journey follows in the footsteps of thousands of pilgrims who have travelled this route to Compostela since the time of the Second Crusade, have followed this route to Compostela.

Thanks to this remarkable project by our spanish partner, people will have the opportunity to experience the Camino de Santiago and the Via Querinissima from a truly unique perspective.

Discovering Pietro Querini's story with Faro De Faris, the mascot and guide of PORT EDUCATIONAL

PORT EDUCATIONAL is a platform created by our member, the **North Adriatic Sea Port Authority**, to give young children "virtual access" to the world of the ports of Venice and Chioggia. Using the edutainment formula, primary school children are guided to discover the professions and activities that take place in the harbours through animations, games and curiosities.

Every year, the platform is enriched with new content. In 2025, three important figures from the lagoon's past are the protagonists of the new section "Faro's Adventures"," dedicated to the most important sailors of the port cities of Venice and Chioggia. Among them is our own Pietro Querini, who — alongside Marco Polo and Giovanni Caboto — serves as a testimony to the experiences that have enriched and characterised the relationship between the city, the sea and the people, presenting them in a simple, clear and entertaining way so that everyone can understand their meaning and importance.



Via Querinissima in Crete

At the **4th Pancretan Hospitality Conference** in Lasithi, our Greek partner **3win Action** presented Via Querinissima to an audience of tourism operators, institutions, and industry professionals, fostering dialogue on Pietro Querini's journey and his historical connection to Crete.

Moreover, 3win Action is developing a series of initiatives to integrate Via Querinissima into the island's cultural and tourism landscape. Through gastronomic and walking routes, a cycling race from Dafnes to Heraklion, and key events such as a Stockfish Festival in Tylissos, an international symposium, and educational programs for schools, the project aims to bring Querini's story to life for both the local community and visitors.




Round table on the return journey of Pietro Querini

February 6

On February 6, Norway celebrates the **Sami National Day** (*Samenes nasjonaldag*). This date was chosen to commemorate the historic Sami gathering in **Tråante** (Trondheim) on February 6–9, 1917, a pivotal moment when the Sami people first united to advocate for their rights and cultural identity.

The Sami National Day holds great significance in **Nordland**, a region deeply rooted in Sami traditions and also home to Røst, the island that welcomed Pietro Querini. Traveling along **Via Querinissima** in Nordland offers a unique opportunity to discover not only the history of Querini but also the extraordinary heritage of the Sami people.
